Bliss Mansion (1879) A Spirited Meeting shall be held here, but please know there is nothing to fear.

Rickey House (1870) This man they call Roberts Roberts will give quite a show and send you on to church as down the road you go.

Saint Teresa (1871) The steeple here has quite the story and the dancers will perform a Danse Macabre.

Stewart-Nye (1860) Are witches really an evil lot? Come hear the White Witches tell you they're not!

Edwards House (1883) The Fox Sisters appear to tell you the tale of ghosts that haunt that may be beyond the pale.

St. Peler's Church (1868) A Crossroads contain spirits past, your evil eye shall protect from a spell that just may be cast!

The legend of the evil eye:

Belief in the evil eye is strongest in the Middle East, Asia and Euope, especially in the Mediterranean region. In some areas where light-colored eyes are relatively rare, people with blue eyes are feared to possess the power to bestow the curse, intentionally or unintentionally.

Witches are thought to be able to bestow a curse on victims by the malevelent gaze of their magical eye thus afflicting bad luck of various sorts. Others think that the evil eye is called forth by the sin of envy.

"No evil eye,!" as told in Jewish folklore, is said to ward off a jinx after something or someone has been rashly praised or good news is spoken aloud.

It is the belief in the evil eye that resulted in the production of a number of talsimans like the one you have been given today. Use it whenever you fear that you have been given the "evil eye!"
